- How did the boy feel when he saw his puppy again?





In the past, tomatoes were grown in gardens in England, Spain and other parts of Europe, only as ornamental garden plants. By the 20<sup>th</sup> century, the first pizza restaurant was opened in Italy. Hence, people came up with the theory that pizza originated in Italy.
