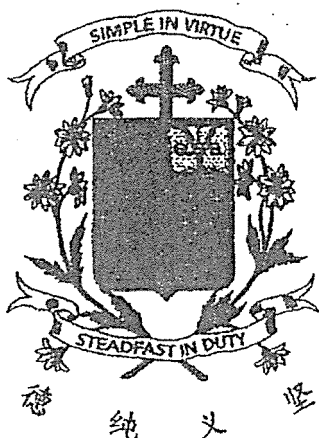

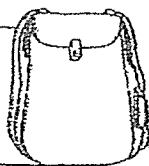

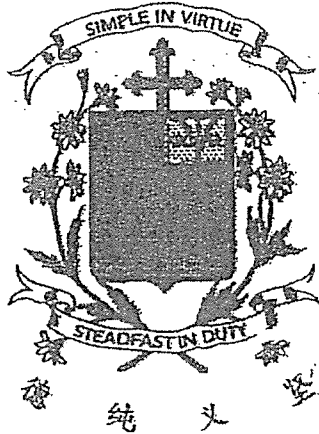

A sunflower produces hundreds of seeds which are found in the flower head. The sunflower has two kinds of petals on its flower head. The disk petals, arranged spirally, are in the middle of the head and are usually brown. The outer petals are called yellow 5 ray petals. They can also be orange or red. These petals help to attract insects and birds for pollination.

People collect sunflower seeds for many uses. They can be salted or roasted and are sold as snacks. Sunflower seeds with black seed coats are crushed to release the oil. People use the oil in their cooking or as dressing for salads. 10

Sunflower petals are used as tea to treat sore throats. The petals can also be used as a sprinkle for salads or in sandwiches. Long ago, people even used sunflower petals to dye clothes.

Sunflowers are giants among garden plants. Not only are they tall, but their flowers can also be bigger than a plate! However, sunflowers do not last through winter 15 and they usually wither by the first frost.
