Section G: Comprehension (Passage B)

Read the passage carefully and answer questions 40 to 46.

(10 marks)

On 23 March, a male zebra, Sero, broke free from a zoo at Seoul Children's Grand Park in Seoul, Korea. It roamed around a residential area for three hours before it was caught.

Videos on social media showed three-year-old Sero galloping through the Gwangjin area of Seoul amid heavy traffic, strolling down narrow alleys in residential neighbourhoods, and passing zebra crossings as it scuttled around the city. Sero had escaped from the zoo by breaking the wooden fencing of its pen. Pedestrians were entertained by the sight of a zebra walking down the streets and sticking its nose into garbage bins. 5

According to Seoul Gwangjin Fire Station, officers received the first report at around 3.30 p.m. about a zebra roaming free around the area. As a team of officers drove to the reported location, they spotted Sero running in the opposite direction, prompting them to give chase. The officers blocked its escape route from a back alley with safety fences, fire trucks and police cars while waiting for zoo officials to arrive. 10 15

A team dispatched by the zoo arrived about an hour later to administer seven shots of muscle relaxant that eventually calmed Sero down. The officials were able to trap it and give it a tranquiliser, which put it to sleep. They then returned it to the zoo on the back of a pickup truck. Upon Sero's return to the zoo, it was assessed by vets and was reported to be unhurt. 20

According to the zoo officials, Sero had been displaying rebellious behaviours after its parents died in 2021 and 2022. It fought with a kangaroo in a neighbouring pen and refused to eat some of its meals. The officials planned to start a training programme to tame Sero.

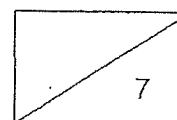

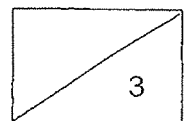
