Wildlife Reserves Singapore (WRS) shared some good news recently. They made known (16)
that a pair of tiger cubs were born last year. This is the first successful birth of the near-extinct (17)
animal at WRS since 1988. It calls for a celebration as it was not an easy feat to achieve.

A total of 400 babies across 107 species were born or hatched in wildlife parks managed by WRS last year. Among these, 29 species are <u>labelled</u> as "threatened" under an international (18) conservation organisation.


