As a reporter for the local newspaper, I was there to take photographs of the otters and then write an article about them. For the past half an hour, the area had been quiet. The silence was interrupted only by the call of a bird and joggers.

The otter family was still asleep but would be up any minute now. Soon, I spotted the first otter. Then, I heard high-pitched squeaks as more otters awoke. They swam along the river, catching fish. One otter tried to snatch a fish from another. Others engaged in playfighting. Meanwhile, an older otter taught the younger ones how to fish. When some otters got tired of treading water while chomping down fish, they carried the food to the riverbank to eat. The otters rested till late afternoon and fished again in the river before dark.

Although otters are native to Singapore, they were not seen much before the 1990s. There are now ten otter families and they occupy mangroves, coasts, reservoirs, rivers and canals. The increase in the number of otters is due to the abundance of clean water and fish along our waterways.
