Archaeological (21)aveedence shows that chocolate is made from cacao beans, which are first used in ancient Mexico around 3500 years ago. At that time, drinks were made with cacao and chilli, ingredients which were asosiated with power and wealth. These beverages were (24)diffrent from the chocolate that we know today - they were very bitter. The cacao tree, from which these beans come from, is native in Central and South America. This tree thrives in tropical rainforests, and each cocoa fruit pod contains about 40 cacao seeds. The seeds are dried and roasted to creating cocoa beans, which are then used to make chocolate products. (28)(27)On the 16th century, as bitterness was linked to medisenal properties, chocolate (29)was consumed for its perceived health banifits. However, once sugar was added, chocolate transformed into a sweet treat and quickly becoming a favourite among the royalty in Europe. Not long after, the beverage evolved into the solid chocolate bars we are familiar with today!
