Maggots are worm-like creatures that live in decaying food or flesh. They can be used to clean wounds so that they heal faster. It was reported that maggots have been used as a wound treatment (16) since a long time ago by some tribes. During World War I, doctors also noticed that soldiers with maggot-infested gashes did not get the expected infections or swelling seen in other patients.

In maggot therapy, the maggots are <u>typically</u> placed in small, porous packages and applied to (18)
the wound. The small maggots will then <u>eat up</u> dead tissue. They do this far more precisely than in (19)
normal operation and can clean a wound in a day or two. However, the maggot therapy is not <u>suitable</u>
(20)
for all wounds. Wounds that are dry do not provide a good environment for maggots to feed on.
