At 18, he started work at an art studio, only to get fired from his job as his bosses felt that he lacked imagination. His businesses constantly failed due to a lack of money. His first animation series, *Alice in Wonderland*, was rejected many times before it was finally accepted by a cartoon distributor. 5
