

"Go home and ask your mummy about your blind brother! I am surprised you didn't know that he is as blind as a bat! The neighbourhood gossiper, Aunty May, told everyone in the neighbourhood about him!" bellowed Nathan, the school bully.

I wanted to throw him a punch for making fun of my two-year-old brother, David, but I was more desperate to find out the **truth**. With a blurry vision, I ran home as fast as I could with my 5 heavy school bag on my scrawny shoulders.

I kicked my white shoes off my feet and ran to the kitchen where Mother was feeding David. Still panting, I questioned, "Is David blind?" Mother ignored my question. "Is he blind? Answer me please! I need to know the truth!"

Mother turned to me with tears in her eyes. "Yes, he's blind. He has a condition called Leber's 10 Congenital Amaurosis and it is an inherited condition," she explained as she reached out and held my tender hands.

At that moment, my heart was shattered. The **dream** of showing David my cool soccer moves or playing video games with him was cruelly smashed by this **fact**. "Why did you keep the truth from me? I often wondered why he didn't look at me or why he was always tripping over things and 15 I thought it was because he was still too young..." Before I could continue any further, Mother hugged me and cried, "I'm sorry, Caleb. Dad and I just didn't know how to tell you. You would be heartbroken if you knew the truth since we know how much you love your brother."

Suddenly, realisation struck me and I halted the conversation. David was blind but he could still hear the whole conversation. Not wanting him to be affected it, I went forward and embraced 20 him. "I love you so much, David."

As David grew up, he was resilient. Despite the challenges that he faced, he continued to attend the school for visually impaired children. He insisted he would take the bus home on his own. Often, he would walk through the main door looking sheepish and saying the same phrase, "Sorry Mum, I am late. I boarded the wrong bus again."

One day, David burst through the main door excitedly. The school had discovered that David had an extraordinary **talent**. Despite not being able to see, he could replicate a piece of music after listening to it being played once on the piano. Because of that, the school would like him to play solo at the inaugural musical concert. The whole family was extremely thrilled for him.

On the night of the musical concert, the emcee announced, "Now, let us put our hands 30 together and welcome David Lim, a child prodigy in music." With vigour, David entered the stage with the widest smile on his face. Tapping the ground with his white cane, he gravitated towards the grand piano located in the middle of the stage. I sat up with anticipation and my heart was filled with pride when David took a seat on the bench. His fingers flew on the ivory and ebony keys as his music filled the air of the 500-seat concert hall. After he played his last note, the whole hall 35 erupted into applause. David stood up and took a bow, smiling broadly as the spotlight shone brightly on him.

David would always be an inspiration to me. Through him, I learnt that having an indomitable spirit overcomes all challenges. David truly has **that**.
