Right after graduating, Ning Ann chose to teach art and only worked on her paintings during her free time.

In 2009, Ning Ann met an art gallery owner named Han Zhou. His gallery in Thailand exhibited a series of paintings by Ning Ann and they were a huge success. Art critics from all over the world have taken notice of her paintings and consider them to be among the finest art ever produced in Asia. Despite her success, Ning Ann has no intention of changing her lifestyle. She still paints but enjoys teaching. Her students are now her source of inspiration for her artwork.

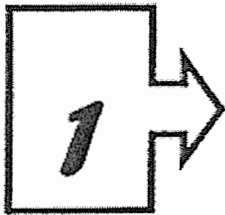

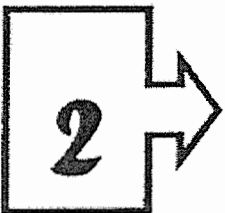

Time: 10 a.m. and 3 p.m. daily

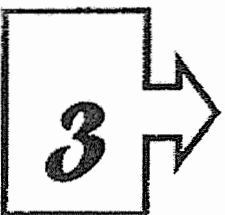
Student volunteers who are passionate artists themselves will show you around and tell you more about the exhibits. Simply be at the entrance of the museum on time.
