

Despite her acts of intimidation, curiosity got the better of me and I inched closer to find little fluffy bundles of about every imaginable colour.

Sadly, one day, they just disappeared but not without a trail of feathers. I knew the animal which had taken Fluff's chicks must have put up a fight because Fluff lost a lot of feathers. By the time Fluff was once again in her protective mood, most of her feathers had grown back.
